1. SUMMARY. THE GOVERNMENT OF COLOMBIA (GOC) HAS BEEN COOPERATIVE WITH THE U.S. GOVERNMENT (USG) IN A BROAD RANGE OF COUNTERNARCOTICS (CN) ACTIVITIES TO CONFRONT ITS COMPLEX AND DYNAMIC NARCOTICS TRAFFICKING PROBLEM. WHILE WE HAVE SOME CONCERNS REGARDING THE STRATEGY AND IMPLEMENTATION OF CN PROSECUTIONS, THE NEW FISCALIA (PROSECUTORS OFFICE) IS PROACTIVE AND IS MAKING A CONCERTED EFFORT TO TRAIN ITS PERSONNEL ON NEWLY DEVELOPED LEGAL PROCEDURES. PABLO ESCOBAR WAS FOUND AND KILLED DECEMBER 2 AS THE RESULT OF A CONCERTED MANHUNT.

THE MEDELLIN CARTEL HAS BEEN LARGELY NEUTRALIZED DUE TO BOTH GOC ACTIONS AND RIVAL TRAFFICKER RETRIBUTION. CALI REMAINS STRONG, BUT THE GOC HAS BEGUN TO TARGET THEIR "CORPORATE" INFRASTRUCTURE AND INITIATED SEVERAL TAKEDOWN OPERATIONS DESIGNED PRIMARILY TO SEIZE RECORDS, FINANCIAL DATA, AND ASSETS. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE SEIZURES ARE DOWN IN MOST CATEGORIES BUT STILL WELL EXCEED THOSE MADE IN OTHER SOURCE/TRANSIT COUNTRIES. ALL COLOMBIAN SECURITY FORCES ACTIVELY ENGAGE IN INTERDICTION, CONDUCTING NUMEROUS GEOGRAPHIC SWEEPS AND CAMPAIGNS TO BOTH DISRUPT AIR TRAFFICKING AND DENY KEY TRAFFICKING SECTORS OF THE COUNTRY. COLOMBIA ERADICATES

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DRUG CROPS, EITHER MANUALLY OR WITH HERBICIDES. THE COLOMBIAN NATIONAL POLICE (CNP) ARE PURSUING AN AGGRESSIVE PROGRAM OF COOPERATION WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES. THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SECURITY (DAS) PARTICIPATED IN SEVERAL SUCCESSFUL CASES IN EUROPE LEADING TO A NUMBER OF ARRESTS AND SOME SIGNIFICANT DRUG SEIZURES. SEVERAL GOC AGENCIES REGULARLY PARTICIPATE IN INTERNATIONAL SPONSORED FORA RE: MONEY LAUNDERING, CHEMICAL CONTROLS, AND DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION. COLOMBIA ISSUED ITS FIRST, COMPREHENSIVE NATIONAL DRUG SURVEY IN APRIL 1993 AND RATIFIED THE 1988 VIENNA CONVENTION BY MID-YEAR. END SUMMARY

## 2. STATUS OF COUNTRY

COLOMBIA REMAINS THE WORLD'S LEADING SUPPLIER OF COCAINE HYDROCHLORIDE (HCL) TO INTERNATIONAL MARKETS. IT RELIES HEAVILY ON BULK QUANTITIES OF COCAINE BASE FLOWN FROM BOLIVIA AND PERU AND LIMITED QUANTITIES OF RAW MATERIALS FROM ITS OWN ESTIMATED 37,100 HECTARES OF LOW-YIELD COCA. MOST ESSENTIAL CHEMICALS MUST BE IMPORTED IN BULK QUANTITIES. COLOMBIAN TRAFFICKER STRENGTH LIES IN FINAL STAGE COCAINE PROCESSING COUPLED WITH RUTHLESS CONTROL OF INTERNATIONAL AND CONSUMER COUNTRY WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTION CHAINS AND MARKETS. MOST INCOME GENERATED APPEARS TO REMAIN OUTSIDE COLOMBIA. A MAJOR SUPPLIER OF MARIJUANA THROUGH MOST OF THE 1980'S, COLOMBIA EFFECTIVELY ERADICATED MOST OF THE 15,000 HECTARES ANNUAL CROP; ABOUT 5,000 HECTARES ARE NOW UNDER CULTIVATION IN SOMETHING OF A RESURGENCE, SOME OF WHICH IS PROCESSED INTO HASHISH OIL. COMMERCIAL-SCALE OPIUM CULTIVATION GAINED A STRONG Foothold IN 1991, BUT MAY HAVE STABILIZED AT ABOUT 20,000 CULTIVATED HECTARES WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF AERIAL ERADICATION USING HERBICIDES. GOC FORCES NOW ARE SEIZING INCREASING QUANTITIES OF OPIUM GUM, MORPHINE BASE, AND COLOMBIAN HEROIN. THE FIRST NATIONAL-LEVEL DRUG ABUSE SURVEY SHOWED THAT COLOMBIANS INCREASINGLY ABUSE DRUGS, WITH BASUCO, A FORM OF COCAINE BASE WHICH IS SMOKED, BEING THE MOST WORRISOME BECAUSE IT IS FILLED WITH POLLUTANTS.

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## 3. COUNTRY ACTION AGAINST DRUGS IN 1993

## A. POLICY INITIATIVES

THE COLOMBIAN CONGRESS RATIFIED THE 1988 VIENNA CONVENTION ON DRUGS IN MID-1993, AND IT IS NOW PENDING THE MANDATORY CONSTITUTIONAL COURT REVIEW BEFORE THE GOC CAN DEPOSIT THE INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION WITH THE U.N. THE GOC PURSUES AN ACTIVE POLICY OF REVISING ITS CRIMINAL PROCEDURAL CODE AND DEVELOPING ITS JUDICIAL SYSTEM ALONG ACUSATORIAL RATHER THAN INQUISITORIAL LINES. MAJOR TRAFFICKER ORGANIZATIONS ARE THE MAIN FOCUS. THE GOC CONDUCTS NARCOTICS CROP ERADICATION (HERBICIDAL AND MANUAL) WITH CLOSE ATTENTION TO

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT. THE GOC HAS AN ACTIVE POLICY TO PROTECT SOVEREIGN AIRSPACE, TO INTERDICT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES, AND TO COOPERATE WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES.

## B. ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

PABLO ESCOBAR WAS KILLED DECEMBER 2, AS THE RESULT OF A CONCERTED OPERATION WHICH, OVER THE PAST 18 MONTHS, DISMANTLED HIS ENTIRE ORGANIZATION AND ESSENTIALLY NEUTRALIZED THE MEDELLIN CARTEL. THE GOC HAS ATTACKED THE CALI CARTEL'S INFRASTRUCTURE, HAVING CONDUCTED A SERIES OF RAIDS ON DRUG PROCESSING LABORATORIES, OFFICES, AND RESIDENCES BELONGING TO KEY TRAFFICKERS. NEARLY 20 METRIC TONS OF PROCESS COCAINE AND ABOUT 100 LABORATORIES HAVE BEEN DESTROYED. ALL BRANCHES OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE (MOD), NATIONAL POLICE, ARMY, NAVY, MARINE INFANTRY, AND AIR FORCE ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN, AND CONTRIBUTE TO, INTERDICTION EFFORTS. NEARLY 10,000 HECTARES OF DRUG CROPS HAVE BEEN ERADICATED BY MANUAL MEANS, AND THE AERIAL APPLICATION OF HERBICIDES WAS CONDUCTED UNDER THE CAREFUL SCRUTINY OF A FULL-TIME ENVIRONMENTAL AUDITOR. COLOMBIA SUCCESSFULLY ISSUED ITS FIRST COMPREHENSIVE, NATIONAL-LEVEL DRUG ABUSE SURVEY IN APRIL, THE METHODOLOGY OF WHICH WAS CLOSELY COORDINATED

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WITH THE USG.

C. LAW ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS:

A NEWLY REVISED CRIMINAL PROCEDURES CODE PASSED IN LATE OCTOBER PROVIDES EXTENSIVE FLEXIBILITY TO PROSECUTORS TO PERMIT TRAFFICKERS TO SURRENDER AND COOPERATE IN RETURN FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF LENIENT SENTENCES. WHILE THIS MIGHT BE AN EFFECTIVE TOOL IN DEALING WITH MAJOR VIOLATORS, WE ARE CONCERNED AS TO HOW PROSECUTORIAL STRATEGIES MIGHT PLAY OUT. YEAR'S END WITNESSED SHARP PUBLIC EXCHANGES BETWEEN PRESIDENT GAVIRIA AND HIS PROSECUTOR GENERAL OVER COLOMBIA'S DRUG STRATEGY AND ISSUES SUCH AS LEGALIZATION, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REVISED CRIMINAL PROCEDURAL CODE. THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SECURITY (DAS) - - FBI EQUIVALENT - - CONTINUES DEVELOPING ITS MONEY LAUNDERING UNIT AND CN INTELLIGENCE RESOURCES FOCUSING ON INTERNATIONAL

CONNECTIONS. DAS INFORMATION LED TO SEIZURES OF A TON OF COCAINE IN MOSCOW, RUSSIA, AND TO THE ARREST OF A NUMBER OF COLOMBIAN TRAFFICKERS IN ITALY AND SPAIN IN 1993.

D. CORRUPTION:

WIDESPREAD CORRUPTION AND INTIMIDATION BY NARCO-TERRORISTS HAVE COMPLICATED THE COUNTER-DRUG EFFORTS OF MANY COLOMBIAN INSTITUTIONS, INCLUDING THE JUDICIAL BRANCH, PROSECUTORS OFFICE, POLICE, AND ARMED FORCES. NEVERTHELESS, EACH MILITARY/LAW ENFORCEMENT BRANCH HAS ITS OWN INSPECTOR GENERAL'S OFFICE THAT PURSUES ALLEGATIONS OF CORRUPTION (AS PART OF THE POLICE REFORM LAW PASSED IN MID-1993, A CIVILIAN COMMISSIONER WAS NAMED IN DECEMBER TO INVESTIGATE CHARGES OF CORRUPTION AND ABUSE WITHIN THAT ORGANIZATION). THESE INVESTIGATIONS OFTEN LEAD TO DISMISAL, COURT MARTIAL AND EVENTUAL CRIMINAL PROSECUTION BY THE APPROPRIATE GOC AGENCY. IN FACT, THE GOC IS CURRENTLY INVESTIGATING THE FOURTH HIGHEST RANKING MEMBER OF THE AG'S OFFICE FOR

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ALLEGED CONNECTIONS TO THE CALI CARTEL.

## E. AGREEMENTS AND TREATIES

COLOMBIA IS A SIGNATORY OF THE 1961 SINGLE CONVENTION ON DRUGS, THE 1972 AND 1974 TREATIES ON PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES, AND THE 1988 UN CONVENTION ON DRUGS WHICH IT ALSO RATIFIED MID-YEAR, PENDING CONSTITUTIONAL COURT REVIEW WITH WHICH WE ANTICIPATE NO PROBLEMS. THE CURRENT ADMINISTRATION HAS SIGNED BILATERAL AGREEMENTS WITH THE USG ON ASSET SHARING, CHEMICAL CONTROL, EVIDENCE SHARING, AND A MONEY LAUNDERING (KERRY) AGREEMENT. COLOMBIA PARTICIPATES ACTIVELY IN THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES (OAS) CARIBBEAN TASK FORCE (CICAD) MEETING ON MONEY LAUNDERING. THE COLOMBIA NATIONAL POLICE PURSUE AN ACTIVE POLICY OF CLOSE COOPERATION WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES HAVING CONDUCTED A COMBINED OPERATION WITH VENEZUELA, A MUTUALLY SUPPORTING INTERDICTION OPERATION WITH ECUADOR, AND FOSTERED BOTH INTELLIGENCE EXCHANGES AND COMBINED TRAINING.

## F. CULTIVATION/PRODUCTION:

1) COCA IS COLOMBIA'S PRIMARY NARCOTICS CROP OF CONCERN. THE MOST RECENT ESTIMATE OF 37,100 HECTARES IS BASED ON A 1992 AERIAL SURVEY, AND DATA FOR THE 1993 CROP IS PENDING. LABORATORY TESTS SHOW COLOMBIA'S COCA TO BE RELATIVELY LOW YIELD, 0.32 PERCENT ALKALOID, ABOUT HALF THAT OF BOLIVIA AND PERU. CULTIVATION TECHNIQUES YIELD ONLY 800 KILOS OF DRY LEAF PER YEAR PER HECTARE, WITH ABOUT 500 KILOS OF DRY LEAF YIELDING ONE KILOGRAM (KG) OF COCAINE BASE. THUS, COLOMBIA'S CROP, MOSTLY IN THE CAQUETA, PUTUMAYO, VAUPES DEPARTMENTS, IS CAPABLE OF YIELDING ABOUT 28,830 METRIC TONS (MT) OF DRY LEAF, OR 57,660 KGS OF BASE, RESULTING IN 51,894 KGS OF HCL. LEAF AND REFINED PRODUCT CONSUMPTION LOCALLY DO NOT AFFECT THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR EXPORT. MANUAL ERADICATION IS DANGEROUS, SINCE MUCH OF IT TAKES PLACE IN GUERRILLA-PREVALENT ZONES; THUS, IT IS MINIMAL. MOD

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FORCES DESTROYED 793 HECTARES OF COCA THROUGH NOVEMBER. COCAINE INTERDICTION, MOSTLY BY POLICE, HAS BEEN ACTIVE: 21,147 KGS OF HCL/BASE, THROUGH NOVEMBER.

2) CANNABIS CULTIVATION IS CURRENTLY ESTIMATED AT 5,000 HECTARES BASED ON VISUAL RECONNAISSANCE OF TRADITIONAL CULTIVATION ZONES. THUS, THIS PRODUCT IS SHOWING SOMETHING OF A RESURGENCE. SOME OF THE 514 MT MARIJUANA SEIZED IN 1993 IS BELIEVED TO BE GROWN ON THE VENEZUELA SIDE THE CONTIGUOUS PERIJA MOUNTAIN RANGE. SOME IS PROCESSED INTO HASHISH OIL OF WHICH 800 KILOS HAS BEEN SEIZED THROUGH NOVEMBER.

3) COMMERCIAL OPIUM POPPY CULTIVATION, WHILE DOCUMENTED AS EARLY AS THE MID-80'S, GAINED A SOLID FOOHOLD ONLY IN 1991. AERIAL SURVEY DATA IS INSUFFICIENT TO MAKE AN ACCURATE ESTIMATE OF TOTAL CULTIVATED AREA, AND INFORMATION ON CROP CYCLE IS WEAK. MANY FIELDS CONTAIN PLANTS OF VARYING MATURITIES. EXTENSIVE AERIAL OVERFLIGHTS ASSOCIATED WITH FUMIGATION SUGGEST THE CROP MAY HAVE STABILIZED AT AROUND 20,000 CULTIVATED HECTARES. PRODUCTION DATA IS NOT YET SUFFICIENT. THE FEW TESTS CONDUCTED ON OPIUM GUM SUGGEST THE MORPHINE CONTENT IS RELATIVELY HIGH. FOR NOW, WE ASSUME EVERY

CULTIVATED HECTARE IS CAPABLE OF YIELDING 10 KILOS OF GUM WHICH MIGHT CONVERT TO ONE KILO OF HEROIN. CULTIVATION REMAINS CONCENTRATED IN HUILA, TOLIMA, AND VALLE DE CAUCA DEPARTMENTS, WITH SMALLER CONCENTRATIONS IN NARINO AND BOYACA. AGGRESSIVE FUMIGATION, USING A SAFE, AGRICULTURAL HERBICIDE REGISTERED AND WIDELY USED IN COLOMBIA, IS CONDUCTED UNDER WATCHFUL EYES OF THE FULL-TIME ENVIRONMENTAL AUDITOR IN COORDINATION WITH TWO ENVIRONMENTAL GROUPS THAT CLOSELY MONITOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT, WHICH HAS BEEN MINIMAL. THE GOC DESTROYED 8,541 HECTARES AS OF THE END OF NOVEMBER.

4. U.S. POLICY INITIATIVES AND PROGRAM.

A. USG INITIATIVES AND PROGRAMS ARE EXTENSIVE AND

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GENERALLY EFFECTIVE, ADDRESSING ALL ASPECTS OF THE 1988 VIENNA CONVENTION, THE CARTAGENA ACCORDS, AND THE NEWLY DEVELOPED WESTERN HEMISPHERE DRUG STRATEGY. OUR POLICIES SUPPORT THE GOC'S STRONG POLITICAL WILL TO IDENTIFY PERMANENT SOLUTIONS THROUGH INSTITUTION BUILDING WITHIN A LEGAL, CONSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK WHICH RESPECTS HUMAN RIGHTS.

B. IN JULY, THE EMBASSY CREATED A FULL-TIME JUDICIAL ATTACHE POSITION TO ENHANCE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF EVIDENCE SHARING BETWEEN THE GOC AND THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE. THIS HAS IMPROVED THE FLOW OF INFORMATION AND EVIDENCE, ENABLING THE GOC TO DEVELOP INDICTMENTS AND OBTAIN CONVICTIONS OF 15 TRAFFICKERS OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS. USAID COMMITS SIGNIFICANT RESOURCES TO JUDICIAL REFORM FOCUSING ON THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SECTOR, INCLUDING SPECIFICALLY THE FIVE REGIONAL COURTS AND PROSECUTORIAL UNITS CHARGED WITH HANDLING NARCOTICS AND TERRORISM CASES. USAID ALSO ASSISTS THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL'S OFFICE CREATED IN MID-1992. US SUPPORT TO HELP THE GOC IMPROVE ITS JUDICIAL PROTECTION SYSTEM HAS ALSO BEEN AN IMPORTANT COMPONENT OF OUR ASSISTANCE.

FOR ALL OF THESE ENTITIES, OUR MAJOR THRUST IS ON TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE. IN 1993, 641 JUDGES AND PROSECUTORS RECEIVED TRAINING FROM USAID, AND 921 INVESTIGATORS, FORENSIC TECHNICIANS, AND OTHERS ATTENDED COURSES IN COLOMBIA AND THE US OFFERED BY THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE TRAINING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, ICITAP, A DOJ PROGRAM FINANCED BY USAID. USAID ALSO HAS AGREED THAT THE GOC USE FUNDS GENERATED BY ESF CASH TRANSFERS TO SUPPLEMENT GOC FUNDING OF PROJECTS WITH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES TO ENCOURAGE THE VOLUNTARY ERADICATION OF OPIUM POPPY.

C. STATE AND DOD RESOURCES ENHANCE MOD AND DAS CAPABILITIES TO INVESTIGATE TRAFFICKER ORGANIZATIONS AND INTERDICT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. COOPERATION ON A BILATERAL AND MULTILATERAL BASIS CONTINUES TO GROW. MOD COMPONENTS COMMIT SUBSTANTIAL RESOURCES OF THEIR OWN TO

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INCLUDE THE ADDITION OF HELICOPTERS TO THE FAC AND CNP FLEETS AND THE PROCUREMENT OF RADARS TO CONTROL VITAL TRAFFICKER AIR ROUTES ALONG THE SOUTHER BORDER.

D. THE AMOUNT OF DRUG MONEY RETURNING TO COLOMBIA IS DIFFICULT TO ESTIMATE ACCURATELY. MOST EXPERTS ASSUME MUCH OF THE EARNINGS FROM COCAINE, HEROIN AND CANNABIS REMAIN IN THE MAJOR MONEY LAUNDERING CENTERS OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY. MONEY LAUNDERING, PER SE, IS NOT A CRIME IN COLOMBIA ALTHOUGH "ILLCIT ENRICHMENT" (DIRECTLY OR THROUGH THE USE OF THIRD PARTIES FOR FRAUDULENT ACQUISITION OF GOODS OR PROPERTY WITH NARCO FUNDS OR RELATED ACTIVITIES) IS. SUBSTANTIAL INFLOWS OF FOREIGN CAPITAL CONTINUE TO ENTER THE COLOMBIAN ECONOMY UNDER THE STIMULI OF A LIBERALIZED EXCHANGE REGIME AND HIGH REAL INTEREST RATES. IN SEPTEMBER 1993, THE CENTRAL BANK INTRODUCED SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENTS TO COLOMBIA'S FOREIGN EXCHANGE CODE. THE NEW EXCHANGE CODE (RESOLUTION 21) IS DESIGNED TO EXPEDITE AND FACILITATE FOREIGN EXCHANGE TRANSACTIONS WHILE IMPOSING STRINGENT CONTROLS ON SPECULATIVE OR ILLEGAL CAPITAL. RESOLUTION 21 REQUIRES BANKS AND FINANCIAL ENTITIES TO REGISTER ANY CASH TRANSACTION IN FOREIGN CURRENCIES, AND TO NOTIFY AUTHORITIES OF ANY SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITIES.

SOME HAVE CRITICIZED THE NEW LEGISLATION BECAUSE IT STILL PERMITS TRANSACTIONS BETWEEN INDIVIDUALS, ALTHOUGH THESE ARE NOT BELIEVED TO INVOLVE LARGE SUMS OF MONEY. COLOMBIA'S FINANCIAL SECTOR RECENTLY DEVELOPED A CODE OF CONDUCT AIMED AT FURTHER TIGHTENING CONTROLS ON MONEY LAUNDERING IN THE BANKING SYSTEM. THE CODE IS BASED ON RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY AS WELL AS THOSE OF THE DECLARATION OF BASILIA, CICAD, THE FED'S "KNOW YOUR CUSTOMER" APPROACH, AND WITH THE BANKING ASSOCIATIONS OF SPAIN AND ITALY.

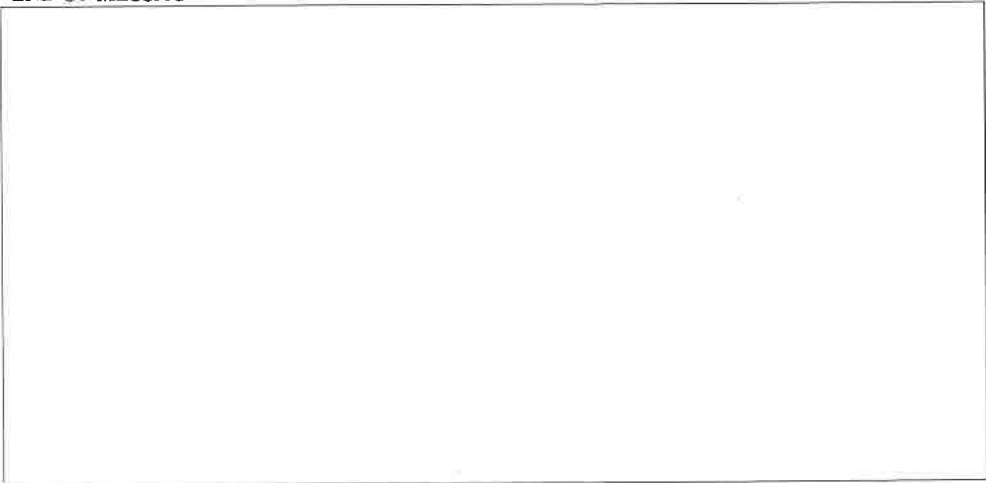
