1. NARCOTICS:

A. COLOMBIA: HERNANDO ANGEL WAGNER, WHO IS BELIEVED TO BE THE SECOND IN COMMAND OF THE SO-CALLED NORTE DEL VALLE CARTEL THAT WAS LED BY IVAN URDINOLA GRAJALES, SURRENDERED TODAY TO A CALI PROSECUTOR. ANGEL WAGNER'S GOAL IS TO OBTAIN A REDUCED SENTENCE FOR ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES IN DRUG TRAFFICKING. WAGNER SURRENDERED A FEW HOURS AFTER HE WAS GIVEN A 17.5 YEAR SENTENCE THAT WAS REDUCED TO A 50 MONTH SENTENCE. (FBIS CHIVA CHIVA PM 230403Z DEC 92).

B. COLOMBIA: THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL'S OFFICE DISCLOSED ON 20 DECEMBER THAT THE BODY OF ALLEGED DRUG TRAFFICKER ALBERTO JOSE ARCILA HENAO, AN ACCOMPLICE OF PABLO ESCOBAR AND BROTHER OF IMPRISONED JUAN DIEGO, ALIAS "TOMATE" HAD BEEN FOUND IN A SANTA FE DE BOGOTA RIVER. ALBERTO JOSE WAS FOUND LAST OCTOBER, BUT INITIALLY THE AUTHORITIES HAD REPORTED THE BODY AS UNIDENTIFIED. THE NATIONAL CIVIL REGISTRY OFFICE LATER CONFIRMED THAT THE BODY WAS REALLY "TOMATE'S" BROTHER, AN ALIAS ALSO USED BY THE MURDERED DRUG TRAFFICKER. (FBIS CHIVA CHIVA PM 230142Z DEC 92).

 - A. COLOMBIA: THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL'S OFFICE ON 19 DEC DENIED RUMORS THAT PABLO ESCOBAR WOULD SURRENDER SOON. IN ADDITION, SECURITY ORGANIZATIONS HAVE REITERATED THAT THEY ARE CONTINUING OPERATIONS TO CAPTURE ESCOBAR. PROSECUTOR GENERAL GUSTAVO DE GREIFF STATED ON 19 DEC THAT IF PABLO ESCOBAR WANTS TO SURRENDER TO COLOMBIA'S JUSTICE, HE MUST DO SO UNCONDITIONALLY. THERE WILL BE NO ARRANGEMENTS OR PREVIOUS TALKS WITH HIM TO GET HIM TO RETURN TO PRISON, DE GREIFF ADDED. THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL THUS HAS CATEGORICALLY DENIED RUMORS THAT THE DRUG TRAFFICKER HAS BEEN HOLDING TALKS WITH THE GOVERNMENT TO SURRENDER SOON. DE GREIFF ALSO DENIED THAT DEPUTY PROSECUTOR GENERAL FRANCISCO JOSE CINTURA IS IN THE ANTIOQUIA DEPARTMENT CAPITOL MAKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE MEDELLIN CARTEL CHIEF'S RETURN TO PRISON. THE GOVERNMENT HAS ALSO DENIED RUMORS OF AN IMMINENT SURRENDER BY ESCOBAR. AFTER NOTING THAT THE POLICY FOR THOSE WHO SURRENDER TO JUSTICE IS STILL IN EFFECT, THE GOVERNMENT AGAIN URGED THE DRUG TRAFFICKER TO SURRENDER TO JUSTICE. THE TRUTH IS THAT BOTH THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL AND THE GOVERNMENT MINISTER HAVE ASSURED THAT THERE HAS BEEN NO CONTACT WITH PABLO ESCOBAR AND THAT STATE'S SPECIAL FORCES ARE TRYING TO CAPTURE HIM.
